

The Greeks and the Pets: Three out of five are owners, and almost all of them have life experience!







The need of Greeks for pets is intergenerational: The young and the mature are now enjoying their company, while the 35-54 are reminiscing about old loves...






I've never had a pet

"Do you personally have a pet living with you at this time? If so, what kind of pet do you have?"










My dog...

Sensitivity of Greeks: half of the owners acquire their dog from the street and often as a gift




Half-breed dogs the most popular choice for Greek owners, but young people (18 -24) prefer dogs of breed






Simple love of the owners as they choose all breeds of dogs...




Owners prefer small and medium sized dogs with a noticeable presence of large dogs over 20 kg






Long-term relationship of the Greeks with their dogs: It proves Commitment and Loyalty!

The attitudes of Greek dog owners on issues of care and living of their pets

Dog owners were placed in a series of sentences about the care and living of their pets, answering Yes/No.

The phrases were:

"I've sterilized him"

"I take him regularly to the vet for vaccinations, teeth cleaning, preventive checks"

"I've put a chip on his shoulder."

"I give him specific food according to the vet's instructions"

"He lives in an apartment"

"He lives in a house with a garden"

"Now and then I give him more food / leftovers"

"I take him for a walk two or three times a day"

"The main reason I have a dog is for companionship"








In feeding their dogs, the owners follow the instructions of the veterinarian, but they also give other foods / treats




Dogs in Greece live mainly in detached houses with garden, but also in apartments




Two out of three Greeks appear consistent with their daily dog walks, with impressive first place among Thessalonians




The reason why Greeks get a dog is neither to guard their home nor the desire of their children...




...as the main reasons for getting a dog are primarily mental well-being, but also companionship!








Greeks prefer stray cats - Only 3% of owners have bought their cat

■ I had her parents before




The tile cat is clearly the most popular choice, while pedigree cats are preferred mainly by young people






Long-term commitment of Greeks to their cats with more than two years of companion care





Exemplary care Greeks declare for their cats: neutering, but also systematic veterinary checks




Double diet plan for cats as well: Specialized food, mainly from the Athenians but also occasionally other foods/specialties





Cats: Most common in detached houses with gardens (mainly men), but dominant in apartments in Thessaloniki:




It is certain that Greeks do not choose their cats to satisfy the wishes of their children...






As the main reasons for getting a cat are mental balance - especially for young people, and companionship!

Perceptions and eating habits for pets in Greece



The perceptions of Greeks on individual issues concerning their pets.

Greek dog and cat owners were ranked on a series of phrases about the care and living of their pets, using a five-point scale:

(Strongly agree/ quite agree, Neither agree/ neither disagree, Strongly disagree/ quite disagree). The phrases were:

"The dog is man's most faithful companion"

"True love is known through the relationship with your dog"

"Children grow up much better when they have a dog"

"The relationship between man and animals is very important"

"People who have pets build more meaningful relationships"

"People who hate or dislike animals are more restricted and closed-minded"

"Caring for a pet makes a person better"

"A pet is a great commitment, responsibility and obligation"

"Having a pet makes life difficult"


"I'd like a pet, but it's too expensive"

"I prefer cats because they have less care than dogs"

"I give a lot of time and care to my pet"



The relationship of the owner with his dog offers primarily loyalty, but also emotional connection...




I agree very much/ quite a lot

Neither agree nor disagree


Disagree very/quite disagree



The majority recognise the power of the human-animal bond and the beneficial effect on children




Cats are not preferred because they are considered easier to care for, since loyalty to all pets is important

"Which brands of animal feed you buy regularly"




I have regular brand(s)

Conclusions and Important "takeaways"

More than three out of five Greeks own pets, preferring mainly dogs (39%) and cats (29%), while the vast majority of Greeks (87%) have had experience with a pet at some point in their lives (now or in the past).

This relationship shows the deep connection of Greeks with animals and the need for their companionship, as nine out of ten owners state that living with a pet offers mental balance, while it is generally accepted that children grow up better with a four-legged friend.

The love for animals is enduring, as the young (18-24) and the mature (55+) now share the experience of living together, reinforcing the intergenerational experience, while the 35-54 age group is in the intermediate stage, reminiscing about old companionships ... Dogs are mainly found in detached houses with gardens, but also in apartments, while cats are more often found in apartments in Thessaloniki.

Conclusions and Important "takeaways"

Most pet owners appear particularly sensitive, choosing a half-breed dog (64%) or a tabby cat (95%), but young owners, aged 18-24, are choosing pedigree pets, mainly for dogs.

It is worth noting that although eight out of ten Greek owners acknowledge the cost and commitment that a pet requires (78%), they are not a deterrent to owning one, as the need for the mental wellbeing offered by their care is stronger (80%).

The owners state that it is clearly their personal responsibility to take care of their dog and cat, while they are consistent in their obligations, ensuring frequent veterinary checks, sterilizations and their safety.

Conclusions and Important "takeaways"

Impressive is the attitude of Thessaloniki residents with nine out of ten owners declaring that they take their dogs for daily walks and preventive veterinary check-ups, while eight out of ten owners have placed chips on their dogs. Athenian owners, on the other hand, place more emphasis on neutering their dogs and on specialized food for their cats.

Owners do not have fixed preferences in food brands for their pets, but follow the recommendations of vets and local pet shops. Their personal relationship with neighbourhood pet shops leads half of the owners to buy their pets' food from them.
