Global Public Trust Survey!

The **international network of independent research companies IRIS** (*International Research Institutes*), to which **Focus Bari** has belonged **since 1991**, designed and implemented this survey, recording public sentiment on critical issues of our time.

21 countries participated in the survey.

Research Objective:

- ✓ Public perception of the economy and personal financial situation
- ✓ Levels of confidence and concern about climate change.
- Status and prospects of health care systems.
- ✓ Use, awareness and attitudes towards Al.




Mental health in Greece:

After the pandemic:


Health above all, for two out of three Greeks, yet they feel under pressure, especially for women and 45-54 year olds




Health system:

Global concern, with the crisis in Greece topping the list!






Positive health system: Countries with optimism




Negative health system: Countries with pessimism



Global consensus:


Poor management as a common denominator in countries' health system problems

Global concern about the way healthcare is managed: Greece tops the list of reactions


"Generally speaking, do you approve or disapprove of the way [country's] national government is handling the issue of health care?"




Satisfaction or dissatisfaction:

I strongly/somewhat approve of the way the government of my country is handling the issue of health care...







Care or indifference:


Different country perceptions of the effectiveness of health care for vulnerable groups

"I am very/ somewhat confident that my country does a good job of caring for the health of the more vulnerable in society ...






Almost one in two citizens worldwide see their country's health care system among the "global elite", but in Greece the reality is completely different, and much worse!

The health system picture for each country


"I am very/somewhat confident that the health care services in my country is one of the best in the world..."





One in two people worldwide trust the progress of medical sciences - the rest are sceptical


"Medical science and pharmaceutical products will be able to solve most, if not all, of the health issues that face of my country today"

Key Learnings

- General view of health systems worldwide: The majority of countries consider that health systems are either in crisis (24%) or deteriorating (34%). Around two in five citizens worldwide consider their country's system to be in good/excellent condition In Greece, Nigeria, Kenya, Panama and Poland, the majority of citizens believe that the national health system is in crisis
 - Causes of problems in each country's health care system: two out of three people worldwide (61%) consider inefficient management poor administration as the main cause of problems in their country's health care system, while fewer attribute the problems to lack of funding (39%)
 - Trust in governments and health systems: Around 40% of citizens around the world express a positive view of the management of health policy by national governments. The highest level of trust is observed in Malaysia, South Korea and Indonesia, while the lowest in Nigeria, Greece and Turkey.
 - Greeks and mental well-being: Mental health is a central concern in contemporary Greek society, with increased pressure and awareness following the pandemic particularly among women and middle-aged people while the pressure for productivity intensifies the sense of marginal resistance to professional demands.
